## CRIME WATCH REPORT

Alert Hiltonia residents who notified police of two suspicious incidents brought about the apprehension of four individuals on the afternoon of March 11.

A woman who spotted two black teenagers trying doors of houses phoned police who picked them up about 1:30 at Stuyvesant and Renfrew. One would stand at the curb while the other rang the bell and tried the door to see if there was a response. The youths were taken to the police juvenile office and held for truancy pending further investigation.

That same afternoon a Hilvista Boulevard resident phoned about a strange car parked at Hilvista and Buckingham. Police found it legally parked but while there spotted a cruising car occupied by two white males. They stopped the vehicle and a radio check revealed one, a South Broad Street resident, was wanted on a burglary warrant, and the other, of Genesee Street, had a police record. Both were taken to Police Headquarters for further investigation.

On February 22 two break-ins occurred. A home on Kensington was entered by breaking glass in a rear door and reaching in to unlock it. Several items were taken but recovered by police in a neighboring front yard. Other items were also taken and furniture was damaged.

Another break-in occurred on Stuyvesant where the burglar broke a rear shed window and reached in to unlock the door. A neighbor heard noises around 4:00 PM but failed to investigate. Several articles were stolen.

Police urge residents to make sure all windows and doors are locked securely when they are away from home. Even unlocked second floor windows can lead to trouble. One such case occurred recently at the Beechwood Garden Apartments in the Hillcrest section when a burglar climbed in to a second floor balcony at night and entered through an unlocked door to the apartment. The woman occupant was awakened and threatened by the burglar if she made an outcry. He took her jewelry box and walked out of the building and eluded the police who were summoned.

The following was submitted to the Heritage Day Commission for possible use in their publicity for the Heritage Days Festival. It is a recap of some of our association's activities.

The Hiltonia Association serves as an effective means of achieving several common objectives sought by the residents of one of the many neighborhoods in the City of Trenton. Through initiatives by individuals, and by groups of individuals residing within the boundaries of Hiltonia, our Association has been successful in promoting the character and history of our residences, promoting improvements of both the public and private properties within our boundaries, supporting other organizations seeking a better City of Trenton and sponsoring improvements to Cadwalader park and other City neighborhoods.

Our Association's social agenda includes annual events such as Easter Egg Hunts and 4th of July Parades for our younger genration, Holiday Celebrations for our adult residents and continuting parties, games and sports for all ages. The Associations's enthusiasm continues through several fund raising activities which have in turn provided support for charitable contributions to such organizations as the Friends of Cadwalader Park, the Guardian Angels, TAWA and Invest-In-A-Cop.

More important than our social successes, our Association has been able to preserve and improve the quality of life in our neighborhood. In part, these successes have been premised on a continuing plan to maintain our individual residences as well as the public properties which together create our living environment. A continuing program of improvements to sidewalks, tree removal and

replacement, and road repairs have all served to create a very desireable neighborhood in which to live.

We have also sponsored several improvement projects to Cadwalader Park vis a vis the Community Block Development Program, initiated and participated in the formulation of Housing Incorporated (a program to rehabilitate City owned houses) and have actively sought to support the State Street Stroll and Heritage Days Festival within the City of Trenton.

In summary, our membership of over 200 Hiltonians have contributed to create a vibrant association which has produced benefits far beyond the cost of the original contributions made by Hiltonia residents in both time and effort.

## THE HILTONIA PLAN — MARCH, 1982 Amended and Adopted

At the March General Membership Meeting the Hiltonia Plan Update (March 1982) was presented to the membership by Ellen Wry. There were several amendments made to this plan in the Section on Cadwalader Park beginning on page 7. Due to the printing expense, this will be your copy of the changes. Please make these corrections in your original copy.


In the Proposed Program Section beginning on page 8, Proposal 4 (page 9) should read "The Association urges the city to formulate a comprehensive plan, with city wide citizen involvement, for the maintenance and improvement of Cadwalader Park."

Proposal 5 (page 9) should read "The Association urges the city to continue to maintain the animal facilities and improve them when necessary."

Proposal 6 (page 9) should read "Specifically, it requests adequate police surveillance of the park throughout the year but in high usage months, April 15 to October 15, we request additional foot patrol to enforce the law, an increase in the number of garbage containers and clear, well-located signs advising people of the rules and regulations governing use of the park."

Proposal 7 (page 9) should read "The Association supports the concept of reasonable user fees, especially in high-maintenance areas such as athletic fields." It was decided to accept this proposal as it now reads but to open it for discussion again when/if the user fees are proposed.

The words appearing in bold type indicate the changes. The Hiltonia Plan was accepted by the General Membership as amended.


## TRENTON ARTS COMMISSION



# CONSTITUTION and BY LAWS AMENDMENTS Please read carefully!

At the March general membership meeting two amendments were proposed for the Hiltonia Association's Constitution and By-Laws. One amendment increases the amount of dues which incidently have remained the same since the 1930's and the other states more clearly the boundaries of Hiltonia. We are publishing these amendments as charged to do so by Article VII of the Constitution and By-Laws.

By-Laws, Article II, Dues, Section 1 now reads as follows:

"Dues shall be \$5.00 per calendar year, per member, payable at anytime prior to the time of the vote at the January membership meeting for the election of officers for that year, and shall not be prorated."

The proposed change is: "Dues shall be \$7.50 per calendar year, per member, payable at anytime prior to the time of the vote at the January membership meeting for the election of officers for that year, and shall not be prorated."

By-Laws, Article I, Boundaries, now reads:

The boundaries of the Association shall be Cadwalader Drive, Hilvista Boulevard, Cornwall Avenue, and Stuyvesant Avenue from the Trenton City line to the Joyce Kilmer Elementary School.

The proposed change is: The Boundaries of the Association shall be Cadwalader Park on the East, the Delaware and Raritan Canal Feeder on the South, the New Jersey Psychiatric Hospital on the West and South and, on the North, the rear property line of those properties fronting on the North side of Stuyvesant Avenue between the State property on the West to the State property on the East and opposite Cadwalader Drive, as shown on the attached map.

Please consider this formal notice of these proposed changes to our By-Laws. Please read them carefully. They will be voted on at the May 11, 1982 meeting.
